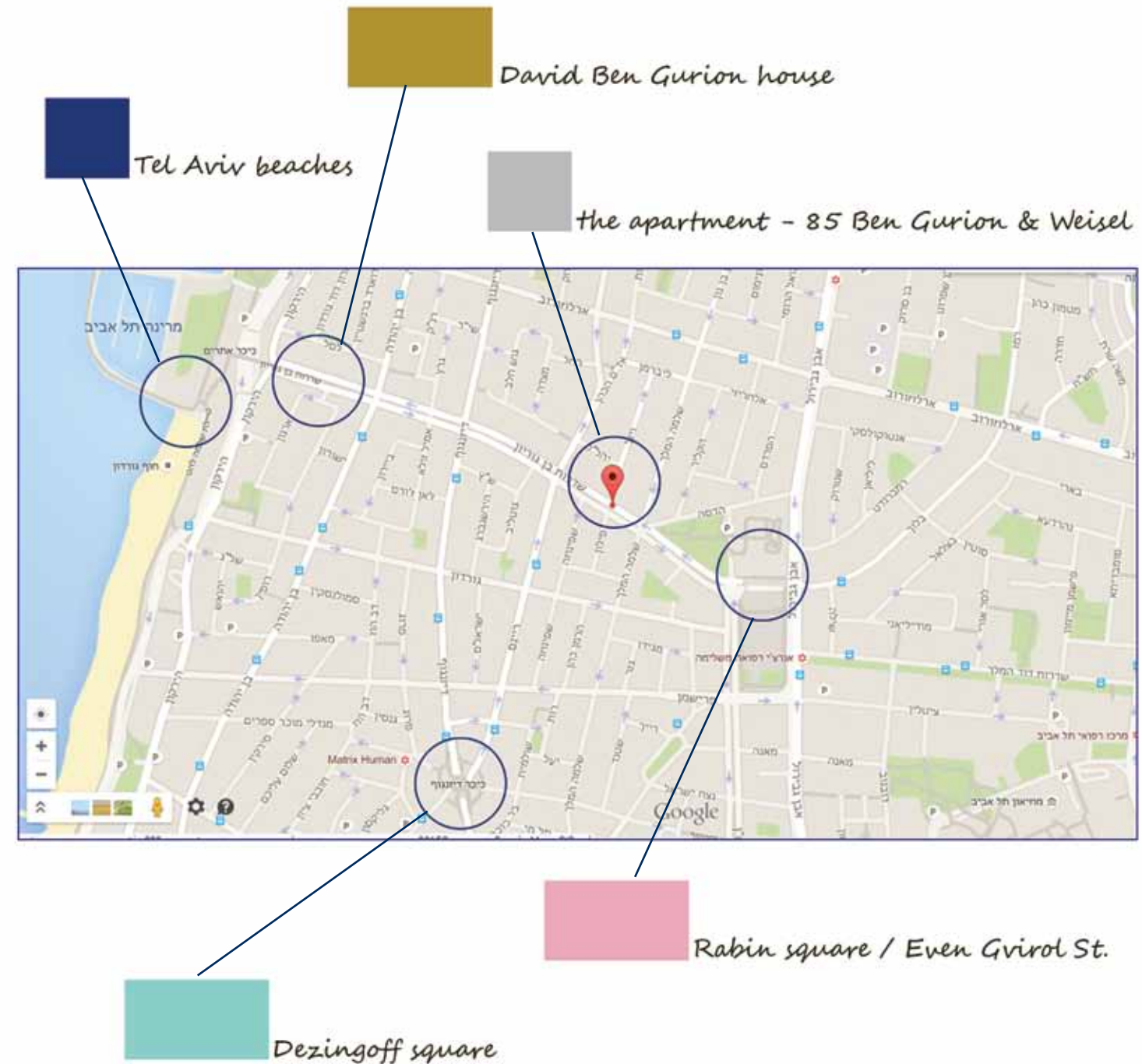
Ben Gurion Boulevard Tel Aviv

Tel Aviv is a major center of culture and entertainment.

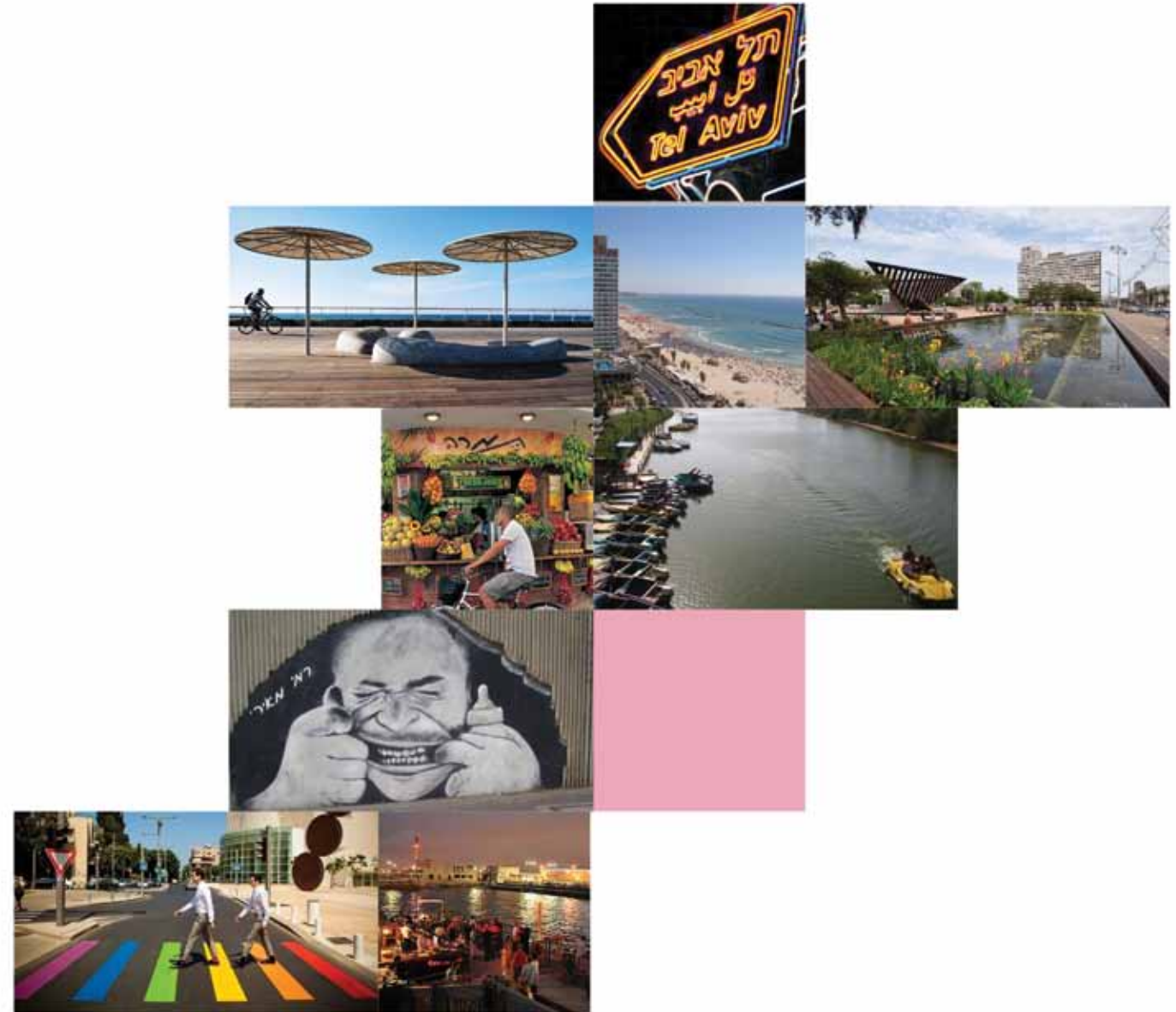
Eighteen of Israel's 35 major centers for the performing arts are located in the city, including five of the country's nine large theaters.

The beaches of Tel Aviv play a major role in the city's cultural and touristic scene.

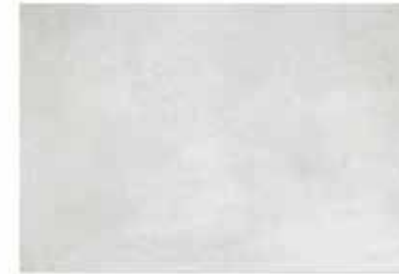
